ENTRY DEADLINE: Friday, July 27

RULES:

- Exhibitor must purchase a gate pass at the time of entry.
- Exhibitor must complete Entry Form on page 57 and Gate Pass and Camping Form on page 56.
- Name of each horse must be recorded on entry forms.
- When filling out class number please use number and letter as indicated (ie: 14s).
- There will be a \$25.00 charge for all NSF cheques.
- NO LATE ENTRIES unless approved by the chairperson. POST ENTRIES may be allowed at an extra \$5 per class and must be submitted to the Light Horse Show Office no later than 8:30 a.m. the morning of the class requested.
- Refunds will be made with a doctor's or veterinary certificate turned into the show office before the completion of the show.

PRIZE MONEY: 1ST – \$25, 2ND – \$15, 3RD – \$10

Ribbons will be handed out to 6TH place.

Classes will be run as close as possible to the prize book, but the management reserves the right to change any order or time schedule or modify any classes they deem necessary. Classes with insufficient entries may be combined or cancelled

STABLING REGULATIONS:

- Fee: \$50.00 for the weekend for box stalls non-refundable. **You must arrive no later than 8 a.m. Friday and leave Sunday after 5:30 p.m.** If other arrangements need to be made, please contact the chairperson.
- A **SEPARATE \$50.00** per stall clean up deposit/stall reservation cheque is to accompany entry forms. Please date this cheque for August 12, 2018. Stall reservation/cleanup fee will **NOT** be refunded if exhibitor does not clean their stall or bring their horse.
- Please indicate on entry form request to be stabled with others. Management will make reasonable efforts

to accommodate special requests but reserve the right to stabling allotments. Absolutely no stall tags to be removed by exhibitors, any Exhibitor changing stall tags or using stalls for tack room without permission may be removed from the show, forfeiting all entry fees and prize money. All stalls and alley ways to be cleaned before 8am each day. **Please keep alley way clean and tidy and no tacking horses up in the alley ways.**

- **BEST DECORATED STALL:** \$50.00 prize for BEST stall or stalls will be awarded. Exhibitors are encouraged to include stall decorations as part of their exhibit to appeal to the general public.

ENGLISH EQUITATION

Pattern to be posted. The class will proceed at least once around the ring at each gate – walk, trot, sitting trot, and canter, and on command reverse and repeat. They shall than line up on command and execute individual tests at the judge's discretion. The judge may ask concerning horsemanship, anatomy of the horse, tack stable management and any others.

The exhibitor will show the horse in the posted pattern.

Judges are looking for balanced, structurally correct horse with adequate muscling. You'll need to show your horse in a good working halter-ropo, braided, nylon, or plain leather. Exhibit your horse at a walk and trot then line up for inspection by the judge.

In-hand trail is a relatively new class that has been added to many breed associations and some open shows as well. It is a class that, just, as the name implies, allows you to lead your horse through the trail obstacles. The obstacles are generally the same as for standard trail classes with exception of lope overs. The in-hand trail class usually includes the following obstacles: a gate, walk and trot overs, back throughs, side passing, a mail box or raincoat, a bridge turning in cones. The course may include all or just some of these obstacles and in general the bigger the show, the more harder the obstacles!

Riders must be dressed in suitable western attire. Entries are eliminated one at a time at the discretion of the judge as commands are not executed correctly. At no time are ring stewards allowed to partake in the judging or placing of the class.

The horse should reflect the versatility, attitude and movement of a working horse, the horse's performance should simulate a horse riding outside the confines of an arena and that of a working ranch horse. This class should show the horse's ability to work at a forward working speed while under control by the rider. Light contact should be rewarded and horse shall not be shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manners and responsiveness maneuver requirements and horse's

quality of movement are the primary considerations.

This class will be judged on performance of the horse over obstacles, with emphasis on manners, response to the exhibitor and on how the partnership of the horse and rider work together. Credit will be given to horses showing capability of picking their own way through the course when obstacles warrant it and exhibiting trust in the rider when negotiating more difficult obstacles. Breast Collar and back cinch are recommended. Attire and tack should be clean and presentable, silver is discouraged. No tail extensions, hoof polish or banded/braided manes allowed.

Failure to follow course or knocking down stake or course markers shall cause a contestant to be eliminated.

NOTICE TO LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

The following definitions will be used:

EXHIBIT: A unit of livestock qualifying for an entry into a class as specified in this prize list. All purebred registered animals, whether owned by one person or by more than one person (individually or jointly) are considered to be the production of the farm or breeding unit on which they are maintained.

EXHIBITOR: Any breeder or farm which presents animals or farm produce for official placing by a judge at the time specified by the fair for judging.

BREEDING UNIT: In each classification where the same or common interests are involved in more than one breeding operation, such operations are considered as ONE breeding unit. In all cases where there is any doubt that more than one breeding unit exists, the interpretation shall be that only one breeding unit exists. The responsibility of proof of separation of breeding units shall rest with the exhibitor(s).

PUREBRED: "Purebred" means an animal that is a purebred of the breed as determined by the by-laws of an association authorized to register animals of that breed.

RULES:

1. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- a) Tuberculosis – tests for tuberculosis are not required for cattle originating from:
 - i) accredited herds or
 - ii) herds from accredited areas in good standing
 - b) Brucellosis – cattle from brucellosis free regions may enter without a blood test. B.C. is currently a brucellosis free region. Exhibitors from outside the province should consult their local District Health of Animals Veterinarian to determine the appropriate qualifying certification. Out-of-province cattle **REQUIRE an appropriate health certificate.**
 - c) The barn superintendent, along with the appropriate breed representatives, will inspect all cattle for infectious diseases and/or other contagious and harmful conditions. This committee has the authority to disqualify any infected animals and demand the immediate removal of the animal from the Exhibition Grounds. This applies to ringworm and unsightly warts as well.
2. Animals from the United States, having met import regulations, will be eligible for entry to the Chilliwack Fair. Any animals suspected of having any contagious

- disease could be ordered removed.
3. In the event of a dispute, any veterinarian expense incurred shall be at the expense of the party in error.
 4. The Barn Superintendent will inspect the barn before 10 a.m. each day with the best interest of the show and exhibitors in mind. If by 10 a.m. any stall or animal has been neglected, the Superintendent shall have the animal and/or stall cleaned out. The owner/exhibitor will be charged a fee of \$5 per animal or stall. Continued negligence may result in the removal of the animal from the Exhibition.
 5. Exhibitors must furnish their own bedding.
 6. All cattle shown in groups must have previously shown in regular classes.

TAMPERING WITH CATTLE: Unnatural practices in fitting will not be tolerated. All cattle entered for competition shall be presented in the judging ring in their natural conformation and natural physical condition.

DAIRY EXHIBITORS: Regulations for showing dairy cattle from Canadian Dairy Breeds will apply.

BREEDING ABILITY: In cases where doubt exists in the mind of the judge or official as to the breeding ability of any animal, the exhibitor may be required to furnish evidence to the satisfaction of the official concerned. It is recommended that all Beef and Dairy animals be vaccinated with a broad spectrum vaccine. Check with your veterinarian for the one suited for you.

The above Rules are **IN ADDITION** to the general **Rules and Regulations at the front of this book**. Exhibitors are responsible for reading and abiding by them.

RULES:

- Please submit signed Standard Exhibitor's Agreement with entry forms.
- **MOVE IN TIME:** All animals and exhibits must be in place by 8 a.m. Friday morning except non-livestock exhibits, which must be in place by 6 p.m. Thursday evening. All vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas by Friday 8:30 a.m. or they will be towed at the owner's expense.
- Release time is Saturday evening, August 11.
- Please have registration certificates available upon arrival, as cattle **MUST** be checked that evening. This includes ALL animals entered in the open show. (includes 4-H)
- No applications for registration or photocopies of registration certificates will be accepted as proof of registration. **NO PAPERS – NO SHOW!**
- Please include Registration numbers on Entry Forms.

Agricultural Society Members: Show your membership card at the ticket booth to get free admission to the Fair.

- All exhibits must be registered in the name of the exhibitor in accordance with the bylaws of their respective association. The certificate of registration must state that the animal is purebred or at least 75% of purebred inheritance. NIP papers will NOT be accepted.

NUMBER OF EXHIBITS PER BREEDING UNIT:

The maximum number of exhibits per breeding unit is unlimited. The 2018 Chilliwack Fair will follow the National Regulations regarding the calculation for a Minor or Country Show regarding the points towards premier breed and exhibitor.

MULTIPLE EXHIBITS: No restriction on multiple exhibits.

SUBSTITUTIONS in the same class can be made up to the time of arrival at the Fair, at the Entry Office. Additional entry fee required.
