### RULES:

1. You must present your claim tag to collect your exhibit and prize money which will be released Sunday, August 13 at 5 p.m. Produce not claimed by 6 p.m. will be disposed of unless arrangements have been made with the Convenor. After Sunday, prize money will be available at the Fair Office 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. until Thursday, August 17. The office will not be staffed after this date. See instructions in **Notice to Exhibitors.**
2. All Junior entries must be set in place by exhibitor – No adult help allowed.
3. Bouquets will be judged first on horticultural quality of flowers and then on blend of colours and arrangement in a vase.

### SECTION A: CHILDREN (Age 6 & under)
